Louisiana, for such cause provided, and the authority vested in me, Sheriff and Ex Officio Tax Collector, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell, assign, convey and deliver unto the said Mrs Georgia Mearcy, the property herein before described, with all the buildings and improvements thereon, provided that the said property herein sold are subject to redemption by the said tax payer or any person interested personally, or as heir, legatee, executor or otherwise, at any time for the space of one year from the date on which this deed or act of sale shall be filed for record in the Conveyance Office of this Parish upon payment by the said tax payer or interested person, to the said vendee herein, or its legal representative, the price of adjudication with interest per cent and all costs assessed. In witness whereof, I have hereunto signed my name at the Parish of Ascension, this 4th day of June 1887, in the presence of David Israel & Louis Butler, lawful and competent witnesses, who also signed herewith with me. Know all men by these presents. Whereas, on the 23rd March 1883 a preliminary agreement was entered into by and between C. C. Palmer of New Orleans acting as agent of John Crossley and Sons "Limited" a corporation domiciliated in Halifax in England and the New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Co. a corporation created under the laws of the State of Louisiana, United States of America, and domiciliated in the City of New Orleans, as to the granting of the right of way to said New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Company, through the three plantations of said John Crossley and Sons "Limited" situated in the Parish of Ascension in the State of Louisiana, in accordance with the maps herein annexed for reference and marked Exhibits A and B. Now then for in execution and confirmation of said agreement the said John Crossley and Sons, "Limited" a corporation created under the laws of England and domiciliated in Halifax in England herein represented by Edward Crossley and Giulio Marchetti, acting in their capacity of directors and John Beach acting in the capacity of a director and also Secretary of the said corporation do by these presents declare that for and in consideration of the price, privileges and conditions hereafter stipulated, they do hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Company a right of way through the lands belonging to the said Jno. Crossley and Sons "Limited" as set forth and described in the two maps annexed to and made a part of this deed and marked A and B. said lands being situated in the State of Louisiana and Parish of Ascension and known as the "Morris Forestmas", the "South Wood" and the "River side Plantations. Do have and to hold unto the New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Company and assigns forever, for the purposes herein after specified and for none other, that is to say, for the purpose of building, constructing and operating a line of rail road on said right of way. It is agreed and stipulated that the said Company is to have the right of way through the three plantations of said John Crossley and Sons "Limited" situated in the Parish of Ascension in accordance with the maps already drawn and exhibited. Said right of way is to be fifty feet (50 ft.) wide except when absolutely necessary and in such cases

the grade wherever it enters and passes out of an enclosure. The road is to be so constructed and maintained as not to interfere with the drainage of the plantations. The Rail Road Company is to construct and maintain proper and sufficient cross-ways whenever said road crosses a plantation road. There is also to be established a flag station in each plantation, during the existence of the road. The New River road station is to be established on the Waterloo plantation and not on the Mount Homeas place. The owners of the plantations are to have the right perpetually to fasten telephone wires to the telegraph poles belonging to the company from the plantation to the nearest company's telegraph station along the line of the company's road. The owners of the plantations shall perpetually have the right to cross said line of rail road with plantation rail roads. Said crossings to be constructed under the supervision of the said company. The owners of the plantations shall have the right to cultivate all that part of the rights of way not in use by the company. The said New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Co. shall have the right to dig earth, cut timber and do such other things on said rights of way as are necessary and convenient in constructing and operating its line of rail road thereon and to fell any timber beyond the rights of way herein granted which is sufficiently near to the track of said road to fall on and obstruct the same. This sale made for and in consideration of the price and sum of Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500^{00/100}) which the said New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Co. will pay and hand over to C. C. Palmer of New Orleans, agent of the said John Crossley and Sons, "limited," as soon as this deed properly authenticated is delivered to the said New Orleans and Mississippi Valley Rail Road Co. so as to be recorded in the State of Louisiana according to law the said C. C. Palmer to receive the price hereof and to grant receipts in the margin of this deed. Witness our hands and seals this twenty sixth day of the month of July A. D. 1883.

T. J. Carpenter to Parish of Ascension

State of Louisiana Parish of Ascension. I am greeting that I, Thomas J. Carpenter of the Parish of Ascension, do by this present donate, give, grant, assign, set over, convey and deliver to the Parish of Ascension for school purposes a certain piece or parcel of land situated and lying in what is known as the Balvy District of the Parish of Ascension, said land containing a superficial area (1/4) of one and one fourth acres more or less, the same to front one acre on the Carpenter Public Road running back between parallel lines to the division line between Secs 28 and 33 T. 8 S. R. 3 East; said plot of land is bounded north by lands of Mr. Hodgson, South by the Carpenter Public Road, East and West by lands of the donor; it being part of 1/4 Sec held and cultivated by the said T. J. Carpenter described on approved plots and field notes as the N.E. 1/4 of sec. 28 T. 8 S. R. 3 East. The consideration and agreement upon which this donation and grant has been made, is that the new Balvy school house is to be erected thereon, the said described piece of land to remain the property of the Parish of Ascension so long as it is used for school purposes, the same to be under control, management and administration of the legal and constituted authorities controlling the Public Schools of the Parish of Ascension. It is further known that Messrs H. E. Brown and C. A. Bulliver of Ascension in their official capacity representing the School Board and Police Jury respectively signing this act of donation and conveyance with the donor in presence of W. P. Dixon and W. L. Hagen who sign with the donor as witnesses. This done and signed this the seventeenth day of the month of August A. D. 1886 Signed, Thomas J. Carpenter Sen & mark = H. E. Brown = C. 


