To Whom it May Concern:

On behalf of our client, Central Louisiana Economic Development Alliance (CLEDA), Eagle Environmental Services, Inc. (Eagle) respectfully requests a letter of concurrence regarding the following matter. CLEDA has requested a threatened and endangered species survey for a tract of land in Avoyelles Parish, Louisiana. A map showing the location of the land is attached for your review (Figure 1). Current plans are to develop approximately 270 acres as an industrial park. A map showing this tract of land is included as Figure 2. CLEDA would like to conduct the threatened and endangered species assessment on the entire tract for possible future development.

The property was agricultural land until after Hurricane Katrina in 2005 when modular homes were placed on a portion of the property and that portion of the site was used as an evacuation site. The portion of the property used as an evacuation site is located north of the 270 acre tract currently being considered for development. The modular homes can be seen on Figure 2 adjacent to the northeast corner of the 270 acre plot.

The Louisiana Ecological Services Office online pre-development self-assessment tool indicated that this project required further review by your office and the submittal of additional information as follows:

 - No specific construction plans are available at this time. CLEDA would like to develop the property as an industrial park and therefore, will develop the property as required to fit the needs of the tenants.
