As a prerequisite for site certification, the Noel Site located in Ascension Parish was subject to a Phase I Cultural Resources Assessment Report (Report) in October 2018. The purpose of this Report was to survey the site and determine the presence of areas eligible for the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) according to the four criteria listed in the Bulletin 15 (NPS 1995:2).


The Elise Schoolhouse (03-00763) is referenced in the Report but is not within the Noel certified site boundary. This schoolhouse area is approximately 3.4 ac (1.4 ha) and was built in 1907 (The Louisiana Planter and Sugar Manufacturer Vol. 39 1907). At the time of the Report field effort, exact property ownership boundaries were not verified and during the field work, access was not granted to evaluate the nearby Schoolhouse due to the lack of outside property ownership permission. The authors of the Report believe the Elise Schoolhouse may meet the NRHP eligibility criteria, but the schoolhouse is not located within the Noel certified site boundary and will not be an encumbrance for future development of the certified site boundary.

We acknowledge receipt of your letter dated October 24, 2018 (received October 26) and one copy of the above referenced report. We have completed our review of this report and have the following comments to offer:

Please keep the Abstract to under 1 page. Much of the information included here can be moved to the Introduction.

Given that the Elise Schoolhouse may be affected by the project, we recommend removing the last sentence of the second to last paragraph of pg. ii and the 4th paragraph of Pg. 125. Additionally, the recommendation is that the structure be evaluated prior to ground disturbing activities. We suggest that this be rephrased to state "prior to project initiation" as there may be project components that do not disturb the ground but may have an effect. We also suggest that the last sentence of the section be altered to include a statement that the project effects are unknown, as the erroneous "no effect" statement will have been removed from the paragraph above.

Based on the description of the Area of Potential Effect (APE), the proposed ground-disturbing activities, and the identification of historic properties within the APE, our office concurs with the assessment that the following structures and sites are not eligible for listing in the NRHP: Structures 03-00760 through 03-00762, 03-00764 through 03-00772 and sites 16AN120-16AN122.

We further concur that structure 03-00763 (the Elise School) is eligible for nomination to the National Register. While it is considered to be outside of the direct project area, it is completely enveloped by the proposed project area. At this time we are not able to evaluate the effects on this historic structure without a better understanding of the proposed project. A subsequent evaluation of effects will be required once a federal undertaking has been defined.
