Dear Mr. Brown:

Reference is made to your request, on behalf of Mr. Toby Lowe, for a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) jurisdictional determination on property located in Sections 14 and 15, Township 7 South, Range 12 East, St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana (enclosed map). Specifically, this property is identified as a 360-acre sod farm south of LA-36 and east of LA-59.

Based on review of recent maps, aerial photography, soils data, the information provided with your request and a previous determination, we have determined that part of the property is wetland and subject to Corps' jurisdiction. The approximate limits of the wetland are designated in red on the map. A Department of the Army (DA) permit under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act will be required prior to the deposition or redistribution of dredged or fill material into this wetland. Additionally, a DA permit will be required if you propose to deposit dredged or fill material into waters designated in blue.

You and your client are advised that this approved jurisdictional determination is valid for a period of 5 years from the date of this letter unless new information warrants revision prior to the expiration date or the District Commander has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.
