Dear Ms. McMillan:

We acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 16 December 2019 and one copy of the above-referenced report that was submitted as Due Diligence. This letter is for preliminary, informational purposes only and does not constitute consultation or agency coordination with our Office as defined in 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties" or by any state regulatory process. The recommendation stated below could change once the responsible federal and/or state agency initiates consultation with our Office. Consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office is not a substitution for consultation with Tribal Historic Preservation Offices, other Native American tribes, local governments, or the public. We have completed our review of this report and have the following comments to offer:

Please include the location of 16IV69 on Figure 10. Its location within the greater project area is not shown on any other figure and it is not clear where it is situated on the property.

Beginning on page 31 and Figure 28, the figure numbers in the text are incorrect.

In the Rescue Plantation discussion, it would be important to cite the Mississippi River Commission maps as they document numerous structures on the plantation.

If the proposed project were to require federal permits, licenses, funds, loans, grants, or assistance for development, we would recommend to the federal or state agency or agencies that site 16IV69 is not eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places, and that no historic properties will be affected by this undertaking. Our office has no further concerns for this project.
